Bid Parameters

Par Amount: \$26,485,000*

Maturity Schedule: See Preliminary Official Statement.

Bid Submission Options: PARITY Electronic Bid System.

Basis of Award: District will determine the winning bidder based on the bid offering the lowest true interest cost "TIC" as stated on PARITY Electronic Bid System and confirmed by the District's Municipal Advisor.

Redemption Provisions: The Bonds maturing on or after August 1, 2027, are subject to redemption, at the option of the District, as a whole or in part, from any source of available funds, on any date on or after August 1, 2026, at par.

Term Bonds: At bidder's option.

Bond Insurance: The bidder may elect to purchase bond insurance at bidder's option and cost.

Costs of Issuance: The bidder is not required to pay any of the District's costs of issuance, but is required to pay traditional underwriter expenses (see Bond Purchase Agreement).

CUSIPs: The Municipal Advisor will apply for CUSIPs; however, the winning bidder is expected to finalize and pay for CUSIPs.

Maximum Underwriter's Discount: 2.0% of the par amount, excluding the cost of bond insurance, if any.

Minimum Bid: 104% of par.

Maximum Bid: 112% of par.

Maximum Coupon: 6%.

Adjustment of Principal Amounts: The District may adjust the principal amounts of all maturities of Bonds either upward or downward, in increments of \$5,000.

Good Faith Deposit: No bid check is required to bid. The winning bidder will be required to wire, within two business days after award, a good faith deposit of \$250,000.

Right of Rejection or Waiver: The District reserves the right to reject any and all bids, or waive any irregularity or informality in any bid.

Establishment of Issue Price: The District intends that the provisions of Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-1(f)(3)(i) (defining "competitive sale" for purposes of establishing the issue price of the Bonds) will apply. In the event that competitive sale requirements are not satisfied, the winning bidder will be asked to hold-the-price and/or satisfy the 10% rule as described in the form of the Bond Purchase Agreement.

Bond Purchase Agreement: The winning bidder will be expected to execute the Bond Purchase Agreement, the form of which is attached, on the day of the bid award.

BOND PURCHASE AGREEMENT

Ladies and Gentlemen:

_____ (the "Underwriter") offers to enter into this Bond Purchase Agreement (the "Bond Purchase Agreement") with the Natomas Unified School District (the "District") which, upon your acceptance hereof, will be binding upon the District and the Underwriter. This offer is made subject to the written acceptance of this Bond Purchase Agreement by the District and delivery of such acceptance to the Underwriter at or prior to 11:59 P.M., California time, on the date hereof.

Purchase and Sale of the Bonds. Upon the terms and conditions and in reliance upon the representations, warranties and agreements herein set forth, the Underwriter hereby agrees to purchase from the District for reoffering to the public, and the District hereby agrees to sell to the Underwriter for such purpose, all (but not less than all) of \$_____ in aggregate principal amount of the District's 2020 General Obligation Refunding Bonds (the "2020 Refunding Bonds"). The purchase price for the 2020 Refunding Bonds shall be \$_____ (being equal to the aggregate principal amount of the 2020 Refunding Bonds (\$_____)), plus an original issue premium of \$_____, less an Underwriter's discount of \$_____. Such amount will be remitted by the Underwriter as follows: \$_____ to Zions Bancorporation, National Association, as custodian (the "Custodian"), for deposit in the costs of issuance fund held by the Custodian for disbursement at the direction of the District and \$_____ to Zions Bancorporation, National Association, as escrow bank (the "Escrow Bank") to provide for the redemption of the 2007 Bonds (hereinafter defined). [The payment of the principal and interest on the 2020 Refunding Bonds when due will be insured by _____ (the "Municipal Bond Insurer"). The premium for the Municipal Bond Insurer's municipal bond insurance policy (the "Policy") in the amount of \$_____ will be paid by the Underwriter to the Municipal Bond Insurer from the Underwriter's discount.]

The amount of \$250,000 has been, or within two (2) business days hereof will be, wired to the Escrow Bank as security for the performance by the Underwriter of its obligation to accept and pay for the 2020 Refunding Bonds on Closing Date (as hereinafter defined), as provided in Section 5 hereof. In the event that the Underwriter complies with such obligation,

said good faith deposit in the amount thereof shall be credited toward the payment of the purchase price of the 2020 Refunding Bonds by the Underwriter on Closing Date. In the event of your failure to deliver the 2020 Refunding Bonds at the Closing, or if you shall be unable to satisfy the conditions of the obligation of the Underwriter to purchase and accept delivery of such Bonds as set forth in this Bond Purchase Agreement, or if the obligation of the Underwriter with respect to such Bonds shall be terminated for any reason permitted by this Bond Purchase Agreement, this Bond Purchase Agreement shall terminate and neither the Underwriter nor you shall be under further obligation hereunder, except that the amount of the good faith deposit referred to above shall immediately be paid to the Underwriter and the respective obligations of the District and the Underwriter for the payment of expenses, as provided in Section 12, shall continue in full force and effect. In the event that the Underwriter fails (other than for a reason permitted hereunder) to accept and pay for Bonds on the Closing Date as herein provided, the amount of the good faith deposit shall be retained by you as and for full liquidated damages for such failure and for any defaults hereunder on the Underwriter's part, and shall constitute a full release and discharge of all claims and damages for such failure and for such defaults. The Underwriter understands that in such event your actual damages may be greater or may be less than the amount of the good faith deposit. Accordingly, the Underwriter hereby waives any right to claim that the District's actual damages are less than such sum, and your acceptance of this offer shall constitute a waiver of any right you may have to additional damages from the Underwriter. Any interest or other income from the investment of the good faith deposit by the District shall belong to the District.

The District acknowledges and agrees that (i) the purchase and sale of the 2020 Refunding Bonds pursuant to this Bond Purchase Agreement is an arm's-length commercial transaction between the District and the Underwriter, (ii) in connection with such transaction, the Underwriter is acting solely as a principal and not as an advisor (including, without limitation, a Municipal Advisor (as such term is defined in section 975(e) of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act)), agent or a fiduciary of the District, (iii) the Underwriter has not assumed a fiduciary responsibility in favor of the District with respect to the offering of the 2020 Refunding Bonds or the process leading thereto (whether or not the Underwriter, or any affiliate of the Underwriter, has advised or is currently advising the District on other matters) or any other obligation to the District except the obligations expressly set forth in this Bond Purchase Agreement, (iv) the Underwriter has financial and other interests that differ from those of the District, and (v) the District has consulted with its own legal and financial advisors to the extent it deemed appropriate in connection with the offering of the 2020 Refunding Bonds

2. The 2020 Refunding Bonds. Except as hereinafter described, the 2020 Refunding Bonds shall be as described in, and shall be issued and secured pursuant to the provisions of the resolution of the District adopted on August 26, 2020 (the "Resolution"), provisions of Articles 9 and 11 of Chapter 3 (commencing with section 53550) of Division 2 of Title 5 of the California Government Code (the "Act") and other applicable provisions of law. The 2020 Refunding Bonds shall be issued, authenticated and delivered under and in accordance with the provisions of this Bond Purchase Agreement and the Resolution. The 2020 Refunding Bonds are being issued as current interest bonds.

The 2020 Refunding Bonds are being issued to refund, on a current basis, the District's outstanding capital appreciation Natomas Unified School District (Sacramento County, California) General Obligation Bonds, Election of 2006, Series 2007 (the "Refunded 2007 Bonds").

The 2020 Refunding Bonds will be dated the date of delivery and accrue interest from such date, payable semiannually on February 1 and August 1 of each year, commencing on

February 1, 2021. The 2020 Refunding Bonds will mature on the dates, bear interest at the rates and be subject to redemption on the terms and conditions, all as shown on Exhibit A hereto, which is incorporated herein by this reference. The 2020 Refunding Bonds will be issued as fully registered bonds, without coupons, in the denominations of \$5,000 and any integral multiple thereof.

To assist the Underwriter in complying with Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12(b)(5) (the "Rule"), the District will undertake, pursuant to the Resolution and a continuing disclosure certificate (the "Continuing Disclosure Certificate"), to provide annual reports and notices of certain events. A description of this undertaking is set forth in the Preliminary Official Statement and will also be set forth in the Official Statement (each as hereinafter defined).

3. Use of Documents. The District hereby authorizes the Underwriter to use, in connection with the offer and sale of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, this Bond Purchase Agreement, the Official Statement and the Resolution and all information contained herein and therein and all of the documents, certificates or statements furnished by the District to the Underwriter in connection with the transactions contemplated by this Bond Purchase Agreement.

4. Bona Fide Public Offering. The Underwriter agrees to make a bona fide public offering of all of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, at prices not in excess of the initial public offering yields or prices set forth on the cover page of the Official Statement (defined below). Subject to Section 5(c), the 2020 Refunding Bonds may be offered and sold to certain dealers at prices lower than such initial public offering prices; provided, however, that the Underwriter may offer a portion of the 2020 Refunding Bonds for sale to selected dealers who are members of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority and who agree to resell the 2020 Refunding Bonds to the public on terms consistent with this Bond Purchase Agreement, and the Underwriter reserves the right to change such offering prices or yields as the Underwriter shall deem necessary in connection with the marketing of the 2020 Refunding Bonds and to offer and sell the 2020 Refunding Bonds to certain dealers (including dealers depositing the 2020 Refunding Bonds into investment trusts) and others at prices lower than the initial offering prices or at yields higher than the initial yields set forth on Exhibit A attached hereto. The Underwriter also reserves the right to over-allot or effect transactions that stabilize or maintain the market price of the 2020 Refunding Bonds at a level above that which might otherwise prevail in the open market and to discontinue such stabilizing, if commenced, at any time. None of such activities shall affect the principal amounts, maturity dates, interest rates, redemption or other provision of the 2020 Refunding Bonds or the amount to be paid by the Underwriters to the District for the 2020 Refunding Bonds.

5. Establishment of Issue Price. The Underwriter shall assist the District in establishing the issue price of the 2020 Refunding Bonds and shall execute and deliver to the District at closing an "issue price" or similar certificate setting forth the reasonably expected initial offering price to the public of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, together with the supporting pricing wires or equivalent communications, substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B attached hereto, with such modifications as may be appropriate or necessary, in the reasonable judgment of the Underwriter, the District and Bond Counsel.

6. Review of Official Statement. The Underwriter hereby represents that it has received and reviewed the preliminary official statement with respect to the 2020 Refunding Bonds, dated September 4, 2020 (the Preliminary Official Statement"). The District represents that it has duly authorized and caused the preparation of the Preliminary Official Statement and that it deemed the Preliminary Official Statement to be final as of its date, except for either revision or addition of the offering price(s), yield(s), selling compensation, aggregate principal amount,

delivery date, rating(s) and other terms of the 2020 Refunding Bonds which depend upon the foregoing as provided in and pursuant to the Rule.

The Underwriter agrees that prior to the time a final Official Statement (hereinafter defined) relating to the 2020 Refunding Bonds is available, the Underwriter will send to any potential purchaser of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, upon the request of such potential purchaser, a copy of the most recent Preliminary Official Statement. Such Preliminary Official Statement shall be sent by first class mail (or other equally prompt means) not later than the first business day following the date upon which each such request is received.

7. Closing. At 9:00 A.M., Pacific Daylight time, on October 1, 2020, or at such other time or on such other date as shall have been mutually agreed upon by you and us (the "Closing"), the District will deliver to the Underwriter (except as otherwise provided in the Resolution), through the facilities of The Depository Trust Company ("DTC"), or at such other place as we may mutually agree, the 2020 Refunding Bonds in fully registered book-entry form, duly executed and registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of DTC, and in Larkspur, California, the other documents hereinafter mentioned; and the Underwriter will accept such delivery and pay the purchase price thereof in immediately available funds by check, draft or wire transfer to or upon the order of the Paying Agent, on behalf of the District [and the premium for the Policy to the Municipal Bond Insurer].

8. Representations, Warranties and Agreements of the District. The District hereby represents, warrants and agrees with the Underwriter that:

(a) *Due Organization*. The District is a school district duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State of California, with the power to issue the 2020 Refunding Bonds pursuant to the Act.

(b) *Due Authorization*. (i) At or prior to the Closing, the District will have taken all action required to be taken by it to authorize the issuance and delivery of the 2020 Refunding Bonds; (ii) the District has full legal right, power and authority to enter into this Bond Purchase Agreement, to adopt the Resolution, to perform its obligations under each such document or instrument, and to carry out and effectuate the transactions contemplated by this Bond Purchase Agreement and the Resolution; (iii) the execution and delivery or adoption of, and the performance by the District of the obligations contained in the 2020 Refunding Bonds, the Resolution, the Continuing Disclosure Certificate, the Escrow Agreement, dated the Closing Date, by and between the District and the Escrow Bank relating to the refunding of the Refunded 2007 Bonds (the "Escrow Agreement") and this Bond Purchase Agreement have been duly authorized and such authorization shall be in full force and effect at the time of the Closing; (iv) this Bond Purchase Agreement, the Resolution and the Continuing Disclosure Certificate constitute the valid and legally binding obligations of the District; (v) the 2020 Refunding Bonds, when issued, authenticated and sold to the Underwriter in accordance with the Resolution, and this Bond Purchase Agreement, will be the legal, valid, binding and enforceable obligations of the District enforceable in accordance with their terms; and (vi) the District has duly authorized the consummation by it of all transactions contemplated by this Bond Purchase Agreement, the Resolution, the Escrow Agreement and the Continuing Disclosure Certificate. The District will not amend, terminate or rescind, and will not agree to any amendment, termination or rescission of the Resolution, the Continuing Disclosure Certificate, the Escrow Agreement or this Bond Purchase Agreement without the prior written consent of the Underwriter prior to the date of the Closing.

(c) *Consents*. Other than the adoption of the Resolution, no consent, approval, authorization, order, filing, registration, qualification, election or referendum of or by any court

or governmental agency or public body whatsoever is required in connection with the issuance, delivery or sale of the 2020 Refunding Bonds or the consummation of the other transactions effected or contemplated herein or hereby, except for such actions as may be necessary to qualify the 2020 Refunding Bonds for offer and sale under the Blue Sky or other securities laws and regulations of such states and jurisdictions of the United States as the Underwriter may reasonably request, or which have not been taken or obtained; *provided, however*, that the District shall not be required to subject itself to service of process in any jurisdiction in which it is not so subject as of the date hereof.

(d) *Internal Revenue Code.* The District has covenanted to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and regulations promulgated thereunder, with respect to the 2020 Refunding Bonds.

(e) *No Conflicts.* To the best knowledge of the District, the issuance of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, and the execution, delivery and performance of this Bond Purchase Agreement, the Resolution, the Continuing Disclosure Certificate, the Escrow Agreement and the 2020 Refunding Bonds, and the compliance with the provisions hereof do not conflict with or constitute on the part of the District a violation of or default under, the Constitution of the State of California or any existing law, charter, ordinance, regulation, decree, order or resolution and do not conflict with or result in a violation or breach of, or constitute a default under, any agreement, indenture, mortgage, lease or other instrument to which the District is a party or by which it is bound or to which it is subject.

(f) *Litigation.* As of the time of acceptance hereof, based on the advice of counsel to the District, no action, suit, proceeding, hearing or investigation is pending or, to the best knowledge of the District, threatened against the District: (i) in any way affecting the existence of the District or in any way challenging the respective powers of the several offices or of the titles of the officials of the District to such offices; or (ii) seeking to restrain or enjoin the sale, issuance or delivery of any of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, the application of the proceeds of the sale of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, or the collection of taxes of the District pledged or to be pledged or available to pay the principal of and interest on the 2020 Refunding Bonds, or the pledge thereof, or, the levy of any taxes contemplated by the Resolution, or in any way contesting or affecting the validity or enforceability of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, this Bond Purchase Agreement, the Continuing Disclosure Certificate, the Escrow Agreement or the Resolution or contesting the powers of the District or its authority with respect to the 2020 Refunding Bonds, the Resolution, the Continuing Disclosure Certificate, the Escrow Agreement or this Bond Purchase Agreement; or (iii) in which a final adverse decision could (a) materially adversely affect the operations of the District or the consummation of the transactions contemplated by this Bond Purchase Agreement, the Continuing Disclosure Certificate, the Escrow Agreement or the Resolution, (b) declare this Bond Purchase Agreement to be invalid or unenforceable in whole or in material part, or (c) adversely affect the exclusion of the interest paid on the 2020 Refunding Bonds from gross income for federal income tax purposes and the exemption of such interest from California personal income taxation.

(g) *No Other Debt.* Except for the District's General Obligation Bonds, Election of 2014, Series 2020, the District's General Obligation Bonds, Election of 2018, Series 2020A and the District's General Obligation Bonds, Election of 2018, Series 2020B, between the date hereof and the Closing, without the prior written consent of the Underwriter, the District will not have issued, nor will Sacramento County (the "County"), on behalf of the District issue, any bonds, notes or certificates of participation except for such borrowings as may be described in or contemplated by the Official Statement.

(h) *Arbitrage Certificate*. The District has not been notified of any listing or proposed listing by the Internal Revenue Service to the effect that the District is a bond issuer whose arbitrage certificates may not be relied upon.

(i) *Certificates*. Any certificates signed by any officer of the District and delivered to the Underwriter shall be deemed a representation by the District to the Underwriter, but not by the person signing the same, as to the statements made therein.

(j) *Official Statement*. The District has reviewed the Preliminary Official Statement and, as of its date and as of the date hereof, the information set forth therein contains no untrue statement of a material fact or omits to state a material fact required to be stated therein or necessary to make the statements made therein, in the light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading in any material respect. The District will provide to the Underwriter a certificate dated as of the date of the Official Statement and as of the Closing stating that it has reviewed the Official Statement and, as of the Closing, the information set forth therein contains no untrue statement of a material fact or omits to state a material fact required to be stated therein or necessary to make the statements made therein, in the light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading in any material respect.

(k) *Financial Statements*. The financial statements of the District contained in the Preliminary Official Statement and the Official Statement present fairly the financial position of the District as of the dates indicated and the results of its operations for the periods specified.

(l) *Continuing Disclosure*. Based on a review of its prior undertakings under the Rule, and except as otherwise disclosed in the Preliminary Official Statement and the Official Statement, the District has never failed to comply in all material respects with any previous undertakings with regard to said Rule to provide annual reports or notices of material events with respect to the last five years, except as disclosed in the Official Statement.

(m) *Levy of Tax*. The District hereby agrees to take any and all actions as may be required by the County or otherwise necessary in order to arrange for the levy and collection of taxes for the payment of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, and the deposit and investment of Bond proceeds. In particular, the District hereby agrees to provide to the appropriate officials of the County a copy of the Resolution, a copy of Exhibit A hereto, and the full debt service schedule for the 2020 Refunding Bonds, in accordance with section 15140(c) of the California Education Code and policies and procedures of the County.

9. Covenants of the District. The District covenants and agrees with the Underwriter that:

(a) *Securities Laws*. The District will furnish such information, execute such instruments, and take such other action in cooperation with the Underwriter if and as the Underwriter may reasonably request in order to qualify the 2020 Refunding Bonds for offer and sale under the Blue Sky or other securities laws and regulations of such states and jurisdictions, *provided, however*, that the District shall not be required to consent to service of process in any jurisdiction in which it is not so subject as of the date hereof;

(b) *Application of Proceeds*. The District will apply the proceeds from the sale of the 2020 Refunding Bonds for the purposes specified in the Resolution;

(c) *Official Statement*. The District hereby agrees to deliver or cause to be delivered to the Underwriter, not later than the seventh (7th) business day following the date this Bond Purchase Agreement is signed, copies of a final Official Statement substantially in the form of

the Preliminary Official Statement, with only such changes therein as shall have been accepted by the Underwriter and the District (such Official Statement with such changes, if any, and including the cover page and all appendices, exhibits, maps, reports and statements included therein or attached thereto being herein called the "Official Statement") in such quantities as may be requested by the Underwriter in order to permit the Underwriter to comply with paragraph (b)(4) of the Rule and with the rules of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (the "MSRB"). The District hereby authorizes the Underwriter to use and distribute the Official Statement in connection with the offering and sale of the 2020 Refunding Bonds;

(d) *Subsequent Events.* The District hereby agrees to notify the Underwriter of any event or occurrence that may affect the accuracy or completeness of any information set forth in the Official Statement until the date which is ninety (90) days following the Closing or until such time (if earlier) as the Underwriter shall no longer hold any of the 2020 Refunding Bonds for sale;

(e) *References.* References herein to the Preliminary Official Statement and the final Official Statement include the cover page and all appendices, exhibits, maps, reports and statements included therein or attached thereto; and

(f) *Amendments to Official Statement.* For a period of ninety (90) days after the Closing or until such time (if earlier) as the Underwriter shall no longer hold any of the 2020 Refunding Bonds for sale, the District will not adopt any amendment of or supplement to the Official Statement to which, after having been furnished with a copy, the Underwriter shall object in writing or which shall be disapproved by the Underwriter; and if any event relating to or affecting the District shall occur as a result of which it is necessary, in the opinion of the Underwriter, to amend or supplement the Official Statement in order to make the Official Statement not misleading in light of the circumstances existing at the time it is delivered to a purchaser, the District shall forthwith prepare and furnish (at the expense of the District) a reasonable number of copies of an amendment of or supplement to the Official Statement (in form and substance satisfactory to the Underwriter) which will amend or supplement the Official Statement so that it will not contain an untrue statement of a material fact or omit to state a material fact necessary in order to make the statements therein, in the light of the circumstances existing at the time the Official Statement is delivered to a purchaser, not misleading.

10. Conditions to Closing. The Underwriter has entered into this Bond Purchase Agreement in reliance upon the representations and warranties of the District contained herein and the performance by the District of its obligations hereunder, both as of the date hereof and as of the date of Closing. The Underwriter's obligations under this Bond Purchase Agreement are and shall be subject at the option of the Underwriter, to the following further conditions at the Closing:

(a) *Representations True.* The representations and warranties of the District contained herein shall be true, complete and correct in all material respects at the date hereof and at and as of the Closing as if made at and as of the Closing, and the statements made in all certificates and other documents delivered to the Underwriter at the Closing pursuant hereto shall be true, complete and correct in all material respects on the date of the Closing; and the District shall be in compliance with each of the agreements made by it in this Bond Purchase Agreement;

(b) *Obligations Performed.* At the time of the Closing, (i) the Official Statement, this Bond Purchase Agreement, the Resolution, the Escrow Agreement and the Continuing Disclosure Certificate shall be in full force and effect and shall not have been amended, modified or supplemented except as may have been agreed to in writing by the Underwriter; (ii) all actions

under the Act which, in the opinion of Quint & Thimmig LLP (“Bond Counsel”), shall be necessary in connection with the transactions contemplated hereby shall have been duly taken and shall be in full force and effect; and (iii) the District shall perform or have performed all of their obligations required under or specified in the Resolution, this Bond Purchase Agreement, the Continuing Disclosure Certificate, the Escrow Agreement or the Official Statement to be performed at or prior to the Closing;

(c) *Adverse Rulings.* No decision, ruling or finding shall have been entered by any court or governmental authority since the date of this Bond Purchase Agreement (and not reversed on appeal or otherwise set aside), or to the best knowledge of the District, pending or threatened which has any of the effects described in Section 7(f) hereof or contesting in any way the completeness or accuracy of the Official Statement;

(d) *Marketability.* Between the date hereof and the Closing, the market price or marketability or the ability of the Underwriter to enforce contracts for the sale of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, at the initial offering prices set forth in the Official Statement, of the 2020 Refunding Bonds shall not have been materially adversely affected in the judgment of the Underwriter (evidenced by a written notice to the District terminating the obligation of the Underwriter to accept delivery of and pay for the 2020 Refunding Bonds) by reason of any of the following:

(1) legislation enacted or introduced in the Congress or recommended for passage by the President of the United States, or a decision rendered by a court established under Article III of the Constitution of the United States or by the United States Tax Court, with the purpose or effect, directly or indirectly, of causing inclusion in gross income for purposes of federal income taxation of the interest received by the owners of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, or an order, ruling, regulation (final, temporary or proposed) or official statement issued or made:

(i) by or on behalf of the United States Treasury Department, or by or on behalf of the Internal Revenue Service, with the purpose or effect, directly or indirectly, of causing inclusion in gross income for purposes of federal income taxation of the interest received by the owners of the 2020 Refunding Bonds; or

(ii) by or on behalf of the Securities and Exchange Commission, or any other governmental agency having jurisdiction over the subject matter thereof, to the effect that the 2020 Refunding Bonds, or obligations of the general character of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, including any and all underlying arrangements, are not exempt from registration under the Securities Act of 1933, as amended;

(2) legislation enacted by the legislature of the State of California (the “State”), or a decision rendered by a court of the State, or a ruling, order, or regulation (final or temporary) made by State authority, which would have the effect of changing, directly or indirectly, the State tax consequences of interest on obligations of the general character of the 2020 Refunding Bonds in the hands of the holders thereof, or

(3) the declaration of war or engagement in major military hostilities by the United States, any outbreak or escalation of hostilities or the occurrence of any other national emergency or calamity relating to the effective operation of the government or the financial community in the United States;

(4) the declaration of a general banking moratorium by federal, New York or California authorities, or the general suspension of trading on any national securities exchange;

(5) the imposition by the New York Stock Exchange, other national securities exchange, or any governmental authority, of any material restrictions not now in force with respect to the 2020 Refunding Bonds, or obligations of the general character of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, or securities generally, or the material increase of any such restrictions now in force, including those relating to the extension of credit by, or the charge to the net capital requirements of, the Underwriter;

(6) an order, decree or injunction of any court of competent jurisdiction, or order, filing, regulation or official statement by the Securities and Exchange Commission, or any other governmental agency having jurisdiction over the subject matter thereof, issued or made to the effect that the issuance, offering or sale of obligations of the general character of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, or the issuance, offering or sale of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, as contemplated hereby or by the Official Statement, is or would be in violation of the federal securities laws, as amended and then in effect;

(7) there shall have occurred or any notice shall have been given of the intended withdrawal, downgrading or placement on credit watch of any rating of the District's outstanding indebtedness by a national rating agency; or

(8) any event occurring, or information becoming known which, in the reasonable judgment of the Underwriter, makes untrue in any material adverse respect any statement or information contained in the Official Statement, or has the effect that the Official Statement contains any untrue statement of a material fact or omits to state a material fact required to be stated therein or necessary to make the statements made therein, in light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading.

(e) *Delivery of Documents.* At or prior to the date of the Closing, Bond Counsel shall deliver sufficient copies of the following documents, in each case dated as of the date of the Closing and satisfactory in form and substance to the Underwriter:

(1) **Bond Opinion.** An approving opinion of Bond Counsel, as to the validity and tax-exempt status of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, dated the date of the Closing, addressed to the District, in the form attached to the Official Statement as Appendix C;

(2) **Reliance Letter.** A reliance letter from Bond Counsel to the effect that the Underwriter can rely upon the approving opinion described in (e)(1) above;

(3) **Supplemental Opinion.** A supplemental opinion of Bond Counsel, dated the date of the Closing, addressed to the Underwriter to the effect that:

(i) this Bond Purchase Agreement has been duly executed and delivered by the District and, assuming due authorization, execution and delivery by and validity against the Underwriter, is a valid and binding agreement of the District, subject to bankruptcy, insolvency, reorganization, arrangement, moratorium, fraudulent conveyance and other laws relating to or affecting creditors' rights, to the application of equitable principles and to the exercise of judicial discretion in appropriate cases,

(ii) the statements contained in the Official Statement under the captions “THE BONDS,” “SECURITY AND SOURCE OF PAYMENT FOR THE BONDS” and “LEGAL MATTERS—Tax Matters,” insofar as such statements purport to summarize certain provisions of the 2020 Refunding Bonds and the Resolution and its opinion concerning certain federal tax matters relating to the 2020 Refunding Bonds are accurate in all material respects, and

(iii) the 2020 Refunding Bonds are not subject to the registration requirements of the Securities Act and the Resolution is exempt from qualification under the Trust Indenture Act;

(4) **Certificates.** Certificates signed by appropriate officials of the District to the effect that (i) such officials are authorized to execute this Bond Purchase Agreement, (ii) the representations, agreements and warranties of the District herein are true and correct in all material respects as of the date of Closing, (iii) the District has complied with all the terms of the Resolution and this Bond Purchase Agreement, which are necessary to be complied with prior to or concurrently with the Closing and such documents are in full force and effect, (iv) the District has reviewed the Official Statement and on such basis certifies that the Official Statement does not contain any untrue statement of a material fact required to be stated therein or necessary to make the statements therein, in light of the circumstances in which they were made, not misleading, (v) no further consent is required for inclusion of the District’s audited financial statements in the Official Statement, and (vi) the 2020 Refunding Bonds being delivered on the date of the Closing to the Underwriter under this Bond Purchase Agreement substantially conform to the descriptions thereof contained in the Resolution;

(5) **Arbitrage.** A non-arbitrage certificate of the District in a form satisfactory to Bond Counsel;

[(6) **Policy.** The Policy, issued by the Municipal Bond Insurer;

(7) **Certificate of the Municipal Bond Insurer.** A certificate of the Municipal Bond Insurer or an opinion of counsel to the Municipal Bond Insurer, dated the date of the Closing, to the effect that the information in the Official Statement regarding the Policy and the Municipal Bond Insurer under the caption “MUNICIPAL BOND INSURANCE” and contained in an appendix to the Official Statement containing a specimen of the Policy, is accurate in all material respects;

(8) **Opinion of Counsel to the Municipal Bond Insurer.** An opinion of counsel to the Municipal Bond Insurer as to the validity and enforceability of the Policy, in form and content satisfactory to Bond Counsel and the Underwriter;]

(9) **Ratings.** Evidence satisfactory to the Underwriter that the 2020 Refunding Bonds shall have received an underlying rating of “A” from S&P Global Ratings, a Standard & Poor’s Financial Services LLC business (“S&P”), an underlying rating of “A1” from Moody’s Investors Service [and an insured rating of “AA” from S&P], and that such ratings have not been revoked or downgraded;

(10) **Resolution.** A certificate, together with fully executed copies of the Resolution, of the Secretary of the District Board of Trustees to the effect that:

(i) such copies are true and correct copies of the Resolution, and

(ii) that the Resolution was duly adopted and has not been modified, amended, rescinded or revoked and is in full force and effect on the date of the Closing;

(11) **Official Statement.** Certificates of the appropriate officials of the District evidencing their determinations respecting the Official Statement in accordance with the Rule;

(12) **Escrow Agreement.** An executed copies of the Escrow Agreement;

(13) Certificate of Escrow Bank. A certificate of an authorized officer of the Escrow Bank to the effect that:

(A) the Escrow Bank is a national banking association duly organized and in good standing under the laws of the United States of America and has all necessary power and authority to enter into the Escrow Agreement and to perform its duties under the Escrow Agreement;

(B) the Escrow Bank is duly authorized to enter into the Escrow Agreement and, when executed by the District, the Escrow Agreement will constitute a legal, valid and binding obligation of the Escrow Bank enforceable in accordance with its terms;

(C) the Escrow Bank is not in breach of or default under any law or administrative rule or regulation of the State of California or of any department, division, agency or instrumentality thereof, of any applicable court or administrative decree or order, or any other instrument to which the Escrow Bank is a party or is otherwise subject or bound and which would materially impair the ability of the Escrow Bank to perform its obligations under the Escrow Agreement;

(D) no action, suit, proceeding, inquiry or investigation, at law or in equity, before or by any court, regulatory agency, public board or body, is pending or threatened in any way affecting the existence of the Escrow Bank or the titles of its directors or officers to their respective offices, or seeking to restrain or enjoin the application of the proceeds thereof in accordance with the Escrow Agreement, or in any way contesting or affecting the validity or enforceability of the Escrow Agreement;

(E) the execution and delivery of the Escrow Agreement will not conflict with or constitute a breach of or default under the Escrow Bank's duties under such documents, or any law, administrative regulation, court decree, resolution, charter, bylaws or other agreement to which the Escrow Bank is subject or by which it is bound; and

(F) no consent, approval, authorization or other action by any governmental or regulatory authority having jurisdiction over the Escrow Bank that has not been obtained is or will be required for the execution and delivery of the Escrow Agreement, the performance of the Escrow Bank's duties under the Escrow Agreement or the consummation by the Escrow Bank of the other transactions contemplated by the Escrow Agreement, except as such may be required under the state securities or blue sky laws in connection with the distribution of the Bonds by the Underwriter;

(14) Opinion of Counsel to the Escrow Bank. An opinion of counsel to the Escrow Bank in form and substance acceptable to the Bond Counsel:

(15) **Defeasance Opinion.** The opinion of Bond Counsel as to the legal defeasance of the Refunded 2007 Bonds;

(14) **Continuing Disclosure Certificate.** The Continuing Disclosure Certificate as summarized in the Official Statement and in the form attached thereto as Appendix B, satisfactory to the Underwriter which complies with the Rule;

(15) **Underwriter's Certifications.** At or before Closing, and contemporaneously with the acceptance of delivery of the 2020 Refunding Bonds and the payment of the purchase price thereof, the Underwriter will provide (or cause to be provided) to the District:

(i) the receipt of the Underwriter, in form satisfactory to the District and signed by an authorized officer of the Underwriter, confirming delivery of the 2020 Refunding Bonds to the Underwriter, receipt of all documents required by the Underwriter, and the satisfaction of all conditions and terms of this Purchase Agreement by the District and confirming to the District that as of the date of the Closing all of the representations of the Underwriter contained in this Purchase Agreement are true, complete and correct in all material respects, and

(ii) the certification of the Underwriter, in form satisfactory to Bond Counsel, regarding the prices at which the 2020 Refunding Bonds have been reoffered to the public, as described in Section 1;

(16) **Verification Report.** The report of Causey Demgen & Moore, P.C. demonstrating the mathematical accuracy of the calculation as to the sufficiency of the uninvested cash in the escrow fund established to meet the redemption requirements of the Refunded 2007 Bonds; and

(17) **Other Documents.** Such additional legal opinions, certificates, proceedings, instruments and other documents as the Underwriter may reasonably request to evidence compliance (i) by the District with legal requirements, (ii) the truth and accuracy, as of the time of Closing, of the representations of the District herein contained, and (iii) the due performance or satisfaction by the District at or prior to such time of all agreements then to be performed and all conditions then to be satisfied by the District.

(f) *Termination.* Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained, if for any reason whatsoever the 2020 Refunding Bonds shall not have been delivered by the District to the Underwriter prior to the close of business, California Time, on October 1, 2020, then the obligation to purchase the 2020 Refunding Bonds hereunder shall terminate and be of no further force or effect except with respect to the obligations of the District and the Underwriter under Section 11 hereof.

If the District shall be unable to satisfy the conditions to the Underwriter's obligations contained in this Bond Purchase Agreement or if the Underwriter's obligations shall be terminated for any reason permitted by this Bond Purchase Agreement, this Bond Purchase Agreement may be canceled by the Underwriter at, or at any time prior to, the time of Closing. Notice of such cancellation shall be given to the District in writing, or by telephone or telegraph,

confirmed in writing. Notwithstanding any provision herein to the contrary, the performance of any and all obligations of the District hereunder and the performance of any and all conditions contained herein for the benefit of the Underwriter may be waived by the Underwriter in writing at its sole discretion.

11. Conditions to Obligations of the District. The performance by the District of its obligations is conditioned upon (i) the performance by the Underwriter of its obligations hereunder; and (ii) receipt by the District and the Underwriter of opinions and certificates being delivered at the Closing by persons and entities other than the District.

12. Costs and Expenses.

(a) The District will pay or cause to be paid all reasonable expenses incident to the performance of its obligations under this Bond Purchase Agreement, including, but not limited to, execution and delivery of the 2020 Refunding Bonds, costs of printing the 2020 Refunding Bonds, printing, distribution and delivery of the Preliminary Official Statement, the Official Statement and any amendment or supplement thereto, the fees and expenses of Bond Counsel, the Municipal Advisor, any counsel to the District, the District's accountants and the Paying Agent and any fees charged by investment rating agencies for the rating of the 2020 Refunding Bonds. In the event this Bond Purchase Agreement shall terminate because of the default of the Underwriter, the District will, nevertheless, pay, or cause to be paid, all of the expenses specified above.

(b) All out-of-pocket expenses of the Underwriter, including the California Debt and Investment Advisory Commission fee, CUSIP fees, travel, the fees of any underwriter's counsel, the premium for the Policy and other expenses, shall be paid by the Underwriter from its Underwriter's discount.

13. Notices. Any notice or other communication to be given under this Bond Purchase Agreement (other than the acceptance hereof as specified in the first paragraph hereof) may be given by delivering the same in writing if to the District, to the Deputy Superintendent, or if to the Underwriter, to _____, _____, Attention: _____.

14. Parties in Interest; Survival of Representations and Warranties. This Bond Purchase Agreement when accepted by the District in writing as heretofore specified shall constitute the entire agreement between the District and the Underwriter. This Bond Purchase Agreement is made solely for the benefit of the District and the Underwriter (including the successors or assigns of the Underwriter). No person shall acquire or have any rights hereunder or by virtue hereof. All representations, warranties and agreements of the District in this Bond Purchase Agreement shall survive regardless of (a) any investigation or any statement in respect thereof made by or on behalf of the Underwriter, (b) delivery of and payment by the Underwriter for the 2020 Refunding Bonds hereunder, and (c) any termination of this Bond Purchase Agreement.

15. Execution in Counterparts. This Bond Purchase Agreement may be executed in several counterparts each of which shall be regarded as an original and all of which shall constitute but one and the same document.

16. Applicable Law. This Bond Purchase Agreement shall be interpreted, governed and enforced in accordance with the law of the State of California applicable to contracts made and performed in such State.

Mandatory Sinking Fund Redemption. The 2020 Refunding Bonds maturing on August 1, 20__ (the "Term Bonds") are also subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption on August 1 in the years, and in the amounts, as set forth in the following table, at a redemption price equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the principal amount thereof to be redeemed (without premium), together with interest accrued thereon to the date fixed for redemption; provided, however, that if some but not all of the Term Bonds have been redeemed pursuant to the preceding paragraph, the aggregate principal amount of Term Bonds to be redeemed under this paragraph shall be reduced as specified by the District and, if not specified, on a pro rata basis in integral multiples of \$5,000, as shall be designated pursuant to written notice filed by the District with the Paying Agent:
